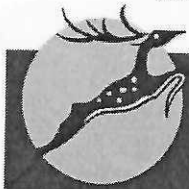

The Government on Tuesday launched a novel recruitment policy for jawans named "Agnipath" for the three armed forces wherein the soldiers called "Agniveer" will serve a four-year tenure on a contractual basis. On the completion of this period, 25 per cent of them will be retained for regular service of 15 years or more. Nearly 46,000 soldiers will be recruited through the new policy and cut the increasing salary and pension bills. Women recruits will also be covered under it.

10L Govt jobs by 2023 end: Modi

Depts asked to work on 'mission mode' to achieve target in 1.5 yrs

In a mega push for job creation in the Government sector, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has directed various Government departments and ministries to recruit 10 lakh people in a "mission mode" in the next year and a half.

"PM Narendra Modi reviewed the status of the human resource in all departments and ministries and instructed that recruitment of 10 lakh people be done by the Government in a mission mode in the next 1.5 years," the Prime Minister's Office said in a tweet.

Employment opportunities have shrunk in the last two years due to a slowdown in economic activities induced by Covid-19 and long-phases of lockdown among several other related factors, economic or otherwise. Opposition parties have been critical of the Government and alleged that it

has kept an estimated "two crore jobs" locked by not conducting recruitment in several Government sectors, including railways and the army.

"The Government, which is looking at the Assembly elections in Gujarat and Himachal Pradesh by the year-end and seven other States by next year, obviously has the 2024 general election in mind in addressing the unemployment crisis. The PM's timeframe for the job creation will coincide with the timing of the next general elections.

The ruling BJP is increasingly conscious of the fact that the "Hindutva card" alone may

not be enough to mobilise the youth which may turn restless for want of adequate job protection 18 months from now. India requires to create at least nine crore non-farm jobs by 2030 if it wants to stay ahead of the rising youth population, according to a 2020 report by McKinsey Global Institute.

Soon after the Prime Minister's announcement, the Union Home Ministry came out with a decision to expedite 10 lakh recruitments in government departments.

In line with instructions of PM Narendra Modi to carry out 10 lakh recruitments in all

GOI Depts and Ministries over a period of 1.5 yrs, Ministry of Home Affairs has initiated steps to fill up vacancies in Mission Mode: a Home Ministry spokesperson said in a tweet.

Government officials concede that there has been scarcity of staff as over the years employees have retired many times over and recruitments have not been conducted. The major ministries and departments like Posts, defence, railways and revenue have the most vacancies. It is estimated that against nearly 15 lakh sanctioned posts in the

Pawar refuses to join Presidential poll race

Meanwhile, the Congress and Left parties have decided to attend the meeting convened by the TMC chief at the national Capital on Wednesday. Mamata, who landed in Delhi

on Tuesday, had a long meeting with Pawar at the Constitution Club and expressed hope to the media on bringing all Opposition parties under one umbrella to counter the NDA candidate.

Congress leaders said Mallikarjun Kharge, who is also the leader of Opposition in the Rajya Sabha as well as Jaisan Ramesh and Randeep Surjewala are expected to attend the meeting convened by the West Bengal Chief Minister.

Cabinet approves transfer policy for UP govt staff

The Uttar Pradesh government on Tuesday approved the transfer policy for government employees for the year 2022-23 and also allowed 100 per cent exemption of tax arrears on vehicles. The government also decided to give incentive to set up units in the medical device park and Pilibhit Tiger Reserve Foundation, and to implement Central government-sponsored Pt Deendayal Upadhyaya Kisan Samozidhi Yojana in the state.

The decisions were taken in the state cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Yogi

Adityanath here on Tuesday. According to officials, the cabinet approved the policy for the transfer session for the year 2022-23 for government officers and employees.

"This transfer policy is only for the year 2022-23," the government spokesman said. "Starting from tomorrow, transfers can be done till June 30," he added.

As per the transfer policy, the officers of Group 'A' and Group 'B' can be transferred on completion of three years in the district and seven years in the division. Only 20 per cent of the present cadre of officers of

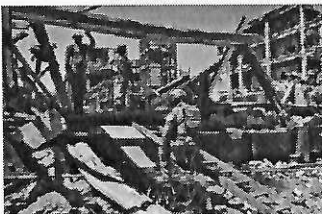

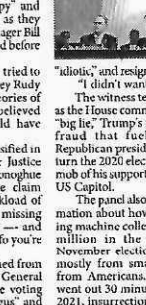

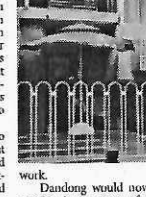

China city mayor apologises over Covid lockdown response

'No doubt I am enjoying my form', top-order batsman Azam, who is ranked number one in the world in both ODI cricket and T20s, said.

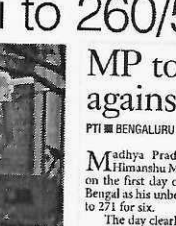
'But with this form my prime goal is to win the two World Cups for Pakistan in the next one-and-a-half years and if that happens I will feel that my runs are worth god.'

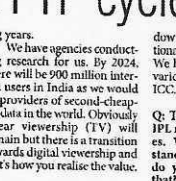

IPL to have two-and-a-half month window in ICC's next FTP cycle: Shah

Attracting astronomical bids that eventually translated into mind-boggling revenue of \$48.39 crore for a five year period through IPL's media rights has not surprised BCCI secretary Jay Shah, who asserted that cricket's most talked about T20 league has potential to deliver way more.

As I am really happy with the kind of numbers that we have achieved. This shows the phenomenal growth potential of Indian cricket. The auction was always going to be exciting for every stakeholder. We have been able to realise the true value and the numbers in front of you, is a testimony to that.

These numbers show the potential of the Indian economy and the faith of investors in New India. The digital India push has changed the way cricket is watched in India. So the big outcome of digital rights bears testimony to that.

ions in the BCCI when it was decided to scale up the cumulative base price of media rights in excess of \$32,500 crore when the winning bid during the last media rights auction was almost half (\$16,347.50 crore) of it?

Yes, the BCCI never felt that the base price was too high. You need to understand that in 2018, it was for 60 games. For the next cycle, we will have 410 games, with 74 games each in the first two seasons and then 84 games in the next and finally 94 in the 2027 edition.

You also need to check the digital numbers — there were approximately 560 million digital viewers in 2017 and 665 million in 2021. You expect it to grow even more in the coming years.

We have agencies conducting research for us. By 2024, there will be 900 million internet users in India as we would be providers of second-cheapest data in the world. Obviously linear viewership (TV) will remain but there is a transition towards digital viewership and that's how you realise the value.

Q: You are talking about having 94 matches in the future. How do you plan to manage the window and various international teams having their own FTP commitments?

A: That is an aspect we have worked upon. Let me inform you that from the next ICC FTP calendar, IPL will have an official two-and-a-half month window so that all the top international cricketers can participate. We have had discussions with various boards as well as the ICC.

Q: There is speculation that IPL may be held in two phases. Where does the BCCI stand on that aspect and how do you plan to implement that?

A: We are having discussions with various stake-holders. There are also multiple proposals for all the IPL franchises of playing friendly overseas. That idea is being seriously contemplated but for that we also need to speak to other boards as we would need to know the schedule of international players.

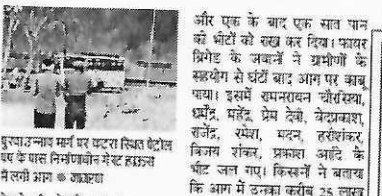
